DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL

Office of Civil Rights and Public Trust, Kent or New Castle County

The Office of Civil Rights and Public Trust (“OCRPT”) has statewide-jurisdiction and is responsible for protecting individual rights and liberties of Delawareans and enforcement of laws designed to ensure citizen trust in government. The Office of Civil Rights & Public Trust conducts investigations and litigation where the Department of Justice’s other responsibilities might present the appearance of a conflict of interest.

This office handles criminal investigations and, where appropriate, prosecutions of criminal conduct committed by public officials and employees. Additionally, the Office of Civil Rights & Public Trust investigates and litigates complaints involving allegations of pattern and practice discrimination. Further, the office is charged with enforcing violations of election laws in Superior Court. This office also handles officer-involved use of deadly force and non-deadly force where a substantial injury or death occurs.

Description of Duties:

The attorney selected for this position will be a litigator with a strong dedication to justice. The ideal candidate will be comfortable independently handling complex investigations and/or litigation. Further, this Deputy Attorney General will have a keen understanding of admissible evidence, command of applicable statutes, and an ability to present cases to a jury.

Duties include working closely with the Director and investigators, directing investigations, reviewing reports and analyzing the investigative findings to determine whether to either file criminal charges or pursue civil remedies. This Deputy Attorney General will review the facts and law and make recommendations on what cases to pursue in order to fulfill the mission of the Office of Civil Rights & Public Trust. The Deputy Attorney General will assist in the evaluation of applications under the Actual Innocence Program to determine whether applicants meet the criteria for review of their criminal convictions.

Strengths include the ability to evaluate cases, determine resolutions, and anticipate legal issues. Knowledge of up-to-date investigative methods and the ability to research accurately and effectively is critical. This Deputy Attorney General will communicate the legal issues in concise and thorough written communications. Must have or be able to develop a good working relationship with other Deputy Attorneys General, investigators, support staff, court personnel, and other external agencies. Must have the ability and determination to learn and apply the relevant laws and Court rules applicable to the matters handled by the OCRPT.
